Simon Banks – Board Director, National Security Inspectorate

Mark Babington - Transport for West Midlands



Mark has been with Transport for West Midlands (formerly Centro) for eight years and has the responsibility of reducing crime and making passengers of the West Midlands feel safer on public transport.

With 15 years of community safety experience, he leads the Safer Travel Partnership which includes 2 Police Forces, Security staff, an ASB Team and a 1200 camera CCTV control centre which opened 18 months ago. Since joining, crime on the transport network has reduced by 67%.
