## SPEAKERS

### **Geoff Revill, Krowdthink Ltd**



Geoff Revill is the Managing Director and Co-Founder of Krowdthink Ltd. He is a 35+ year experienced digital innovator who has worked in Silicon Valley leading product teams of 300+ software engineers developing what become an Internet of Things developer toolchain for Intel.

In 2017 he led Krowdthink's bid to win the Home Office and Office of Counter-Terrorism's competition to find innovative ways to 'Improve Crowd Resilience'. This innovation competition followed the Manchester Arena bombing and Krowdthink proposed a method to "Make the crowd a participatory threat sensor and responder". The project was delivered in November 2018 and led to immediate commercial adoption and plaudits from the Security Minister Ben Wallace MP.

### **Elizabeth France, CBE - Security Industry Authority**



Elizabeth France was appointed Chair of the SIA Board in January 2014. She is also Chair of the Police Advisory Board for England and Wales, a member of the British Transport Police Authority, Pro Chancellor of Aberystwyth University and a member of the General Assembly of Manchester University. Until 31 March 2014 Elizabeth was Chair of the Office for Legal Complaints. From 2002 to 2009 she was Chief Ombudsman and Chief Executive of the Ombudsman Service Ltd, which provided the Telecommunications Ombudsman Service (Otelco), the Energy Ombudsman Service and the Surveyors Ombudsman Service. She was a Non-Executive Director of the Serious Organised Crime Agency from 2005-2010. Elizabeth began her career in the Home Office, resigning to become the Data Protection Registrar in September 1994 and becoming Information Commissioner in January 2001.

Elizabeth has been awarded honorary doctorates by the Universities of De Montfort, Loughborough and Bradford and is a Fellow of Aberystwyth University. In June 2002 she was awarded a CBE, for services to data protection.

## SPEAKERS

### Trevor Jones - University of Salford



Trevor was originally a Youth Worker before joining Her Majesty's Prison Service for 20 years. For the last ten years, he has been Head of Security for the University of Salford and is the Chairman of AUCSO (Association of University Chief Security Officers). He is an Alumni of Loughborough University.

Trevor was one of the inventors of the ProtectED Scheme for Universities and sits on the Board. He has great interest in Emergency Planning including Major Incidents and Business Continuity programmes.

### Phil Cain - BT Consumer



Phil has been with BT for more than 40 years. He's worked in every division of the company more latterly in Consumer, Global Services and BT Business and has been lucky enough to work in over 15 countries for BT in Europe, Asia and America. Phil joined the Digital Voice Industry Engagement team earlier this year having spent six years with BT Redcare where he gained a deep knowledge of the special services world.

Away from work, Phil's married and has a 14-year-old son. He loves his holidays and is Marketing Director for Liverpool Basketball where he's also a level 2 coach (he still occasionally suits up for the veterans' team too). Phil's an early adopter of anything whizzy, if there's a gadget to be had, he's got it!

The UK telephone network is changing. By 2025 you won't be able to make any voice calls on the existing network and your devices will not be able send signals in the traditional way. Telecommunication companies have already started migrating their customers to IP Voice. Find out how this may affect intruder and fire alarm signalling and make sure you understand what needs to be done now to avoid any issues after the changeover.

### Michael White - G4S Secure Solutions



With twenty years industry experience and a background in operational management that includes critical national infrastructure sites, blue chip city clients and diplomatic clients across a range of industry sectors Mike moved into compliance and risk management five years ago initially as a consultant and latterly with G4S. His experience includes working in the Middle East and he regularly chairs and presents at conferences both in the UK and in Europe.

In addition to his G4S role Mike was a volunteer Director at the Security Institute, a former Chairman of IPSA and a member of The Court of Assistants within The Worshipful Company of Security Professionals. He currently also chairs the working group at the British Standards Institute reviewing BS 7499, is a member of the group reviewing BS 7858 and is working with the Security Industry Authority as a member of the team reviewing the licence linked training requirements for the security industry. His spare time is taken up with his allotment and as a frustrated Southampton FC supporter and an equally frustrated supporter of the French national rugby team.
