Simon Newman - Secured by Design



Simon is the Head of Cyber and Business Services for Police Crime Prevention Initiatives. Simon has held a number of senior management positions across Government, including at the Home Office. Prior to joining the Police Digital Security Centre, Simon worked as a Strategic Advisor to the Ministry of Interior in the United Arab Emirates where he led on the development of several new crime reduction strategies and a major reorganisation of the Ministry.

Simon's role at the Police Digital Security Centre sees him working with staff and partners across the law enforcement community and beyond in developing and implementing the long term strategy of the PDSC, which works with stakeholders to reduce the vulnerability of organisations to cyber-crime and fraud.

Richard Jenkins - NSI



Arad Parsi—The Suzy Lamplugh Trust



The Suzy Lamplugh Trust help and support people to stay safe from violence and aggression through the provision of free safety tips, managing the National Stalking Helpline and delivering community projects. Staying Safe With Other People is a peer training programme aimed at adults with learning disabilities, who can often be vulnerable to other people taking advantage of them. We're working with adults with learning disabilities and the professionals who work directly with this group to develop a new personal safety training programme which is accessible and appropriate. We have worked in several counties to support victims of stalking – or those at heightened risk of being stalked, such as victims of domestic violence – to stay safe. This has included delivering stalking awareness and personal safety workshops to refugees, distributing safety packs to victims of stalking, and training frontline professionals so that they are able to respond more effectively to victims of stalking who approach them. The National Stalking Helpline offers information and guidance to anybody in the UK who is or has previously been affected by harassment or stalking through a freephone number and email facility. We respond to over 3,500 requests for help every year.

Arad took up the post of Head of Business Development at Suzy Lamplugh Trust in August 2018. A consultative business development specialist, experienced in concerted solution-driven sales, his career spans 14 years of working across private, public and third-sector organisations, from SMEs to multi-layered businesses and institutions, specialising in national and international sales in B2B and B2C settings. Arad's expertise revolves around stimulating and achieving growth in business engagement activities, new business development and effective account management through research-informed market-positioning, leading to formation of sustainable partnerships, greater income generation and revenue diversification.
